He rang his first peal, Grandsire Triples, at Tenterden on 20th December 1924.

He was Secretary of the Romney Marsh and District Guild 1928-1932.

He retired from the General Committee of the Kent County Association of Change Ringers in 1946.

He was a member of the Sussex County Association.

He worked as a gardener.

He died in 1957 in the Eton area of Buckinghamshire.
