Anthony Jesse Brazier was born on 5th July 1928 in Hampton on the outskirts of Evesham.

He was attached to the band at Badsey, where he learned to ring in 1943.

In the 1950s and 1960s he taught several people to ring in order to form new bands at both Badsey and at Offenham, where the bells had previously been silent for some time.

He was the Master of the Southern Branch of the Worcester & Districts Association 1957-1960.

He was the instigator of bringing the Four Shires Guild, which had thrived before the war, back into existence in the early 1970s, becoming the first Secretary of the new Guild. Later he became President of the Four Shires Guild and during that time started very successful outings on one Thursday a month for the senior members of the Guild.

He enjoyed ringing tunes on handbells and attended many handbell concerts.

He was a builder by profession.

He died on 1st February 1996 at Badsey, where his funeral took place on February 10th.
