Benjamin Crawford DIXON (b. 1884)

Represented the Durham and Newcastle Diocesan Association on the Central Council from 1922 – 1923. Attended 0 meetings

Benjamin Crawford Dixon was born at Benwell, Newcastle on Tyne in 1884.

He learned to ring at St. James, Benwell in 1899 and from 1912 rang at Newcastle Cathedral.

He rang his first peal, Plain Bob Triples, at St. Paul's Alnwick in 30th March 1901. When he completed his undated form, he had rung 49 peals.

He rang several peals of Surprise and also rang Stedman Cinques, being in the only 12 bell peal, at Newcastle on Tyne, rung on Armistice Day.

He earned his living as a draughtsman.

Later he retired from ringing and spent several years in Spain.

His place and date of death are not known.
