Biographical Record

FRANK DEVEREUX MACK (1930 – 2000)

Represented the Guild of Devonshire Ringers on the Central Council from 1978 - 2000 and attended 22 meetings

Born at Hawkesbury, Gloucestershire on 27th August 1930.

Began ringing at Churcham in 1946 and was subsequently attached to St Michael, Bristol 1949-1952, St Thomas, Bristol 1954-1959, St Mary Redcliffe, Bristol 1954-1959, Withycombe Raleigh from 1959 and Exeter Cathedral from 1959.

Rang his first peal on 21st February 1951: Grandsire Triples at Olveston.

Rang a total of 1736 peals, all on tower bells/mini-rings. His 1000th peal was rung on 15th December 1990

His notable achievements include ringing 3 peals in a day (all of 4 methods Minor at Easton, Weston and Clapton in Gordano, 6.7.1957); ringing a peal of 10080 Plain Bob Major (Longney, 7.6.1958) and a peal of 16559 Grandsire Caters (Appleton, 10.2.1968).

He was a maker of light rings of bells.

He rang at 3457 towers.
